- 14% of candidates are from the youth category, aged under 35 years.
- The average age of candidates for the 2024 parliamentary elections is 52 years.

Amman - Jordan

As a continuation of monitoring the registration process of electoral lists for the 2024 parliamentary elections, which was observed through field monitoring teams distributed across all electoral districts within 54 teams, RASED team analyzed the age categories of the lists that submitted candidacy applications for the 2024 parliamentary elections, which totaled 199 lists, with 174 lists at the local district level and 25 lists

at the general district level.

The analysis results indicated that the age category of 46-55 was the highest with candidates representing 29%, followed by the age category of 56-65 with candidates representing 27%, then the age category of 36-45 with candidates representing 20%. The age category of 25-35 followed with candidate, representing 14%, while the age category of 66 and above had the lowest percent of candidates for the upcoming parliamentary elections representing 10%.

The results also showed that the average age of candidates in local districts was 52 years, while the average age at the general district level was 51 years.

In related results, the analysis showed that the first Irbid district had the highest average age of 56 years, followed by the Balqa, Ajloun, Karak, and the second Amman district with an average age of 54 years. Next were the Madaba, Zarqa, and Central Badia districts with 53 years, followed by Jerash and Southern Badia districts with 52 years. The first Irbid and first Amman districts had an average age of 51 years. The Tafleeh, Ma'an, and Mafraq districts had an average age of 50 years, followed by the Aqaba

district with 48 years, while the Northern Badia district had the lowest average age of candidates at 46 years.
