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## THE TRENDS OF MPs OF THE 18<sup>TH</sup> PARLIAMENT FOR THE UPCOMING 2020 PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

- 97 MPs intend to run for the upcoming elections.
- 50% of MPs believe that the parliament will not be dissolved.
- 48% of MPs rated the parliament's performance as good.
- 12 MPs have not decided on their candidacy decision yet.
- All first, second and third MPs in Amman will run for the elections.
- Tafila and Ma'an Governorates MPs are the least willing to run for the upcoming elections.
- 15 female MPs intend to run for the upcoming parliamentary elections.

Hayat - RASED carried out a study on the trends of MPs and the 18th parliament for the upcoming 2020 parliamentary elections, where they contacted members of the Parliament by phone to know their orientations, and a total of (128) MPs responded to the study, while (2) remained under study.

The results showed that the number of MPs who intend to run for the Nineteenth Parliament elections has reached (97), with (19) MPs saying that they do not intend to run for the next elections, while the results showed that (12) MPs have not decided yet. In regards to the MPs who expressed their desire to run, their decisions have been linked by some of them to the decision of the party to which they belong, especially the members of the Islamic Action Front.

A question was raised to the MPs about their expectations of the expected scenario of dissolving the parliament or proceeding with the scenario of a parliament that delivers a parliament (meaning that elections are held and the parliament is in place). 31% of MPs said that they expect the parliament to be dissolved before the elections, while (50%) expect that the Eighteenth Parliament will hand over the Nineteenth Parliament, with the percentage of MPs who did not express their opinion reached (19%).

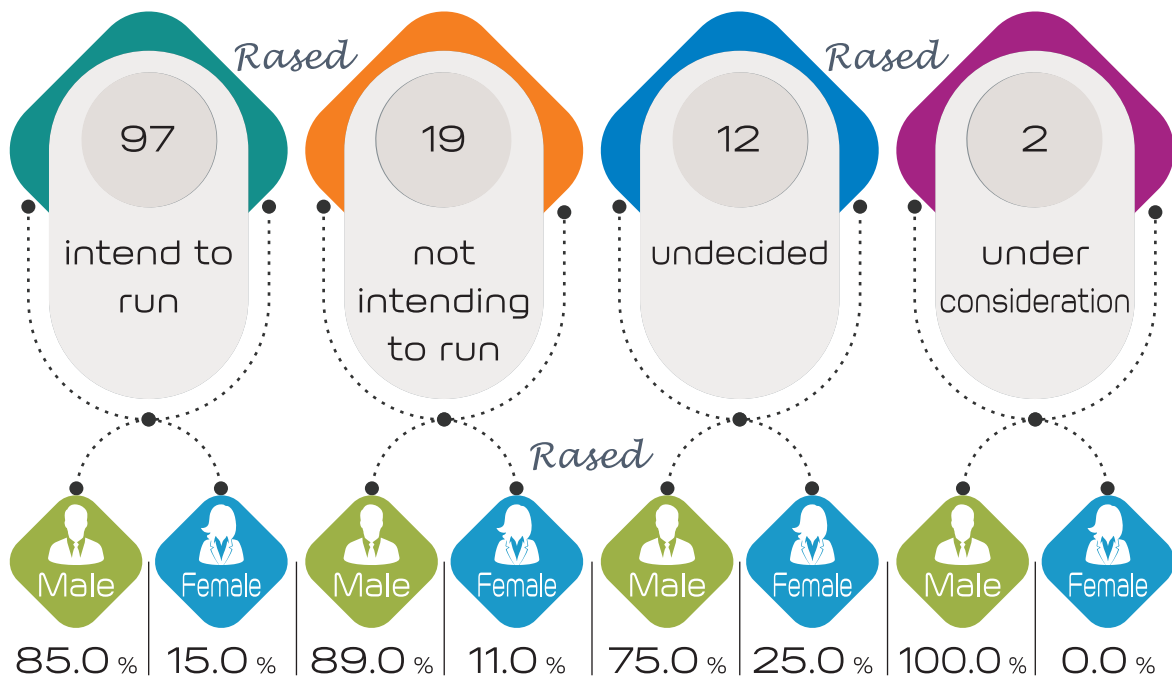
Regarding the MPs' evaluation of the performance of the eighteenth Parliament, 12% said that the Parliament's performance was excellent, 48% believed that it was good, while 31% said that it was average, and 9% believed that the performance of the Parliament was poor.

In the same context, the results showed that the number of women MPs of the eighteenth Parliament who have no intention of running are 2 out of 20 MPs, with 3 women MPs said that they have not decided on their decision, while 15 women MPs have expressed their intention to run for the elections.

The results showed that the MPs of Amman's first, second and third electoral districts, the northern Bedouins, the middle Bedouins, and Madaba intend to run with 100% of the district's MPs, followed by MPs of Irbid's first electoral district with 83%, while the MPs of Tafila and Ma'an Governorates were the least willing to run by 40% each, and most members of The Islamic Action Front affirmed MPs of the «Reform Bloc» wanted to run, but linked their decision to the party's decision.

With regard to the decision to dissolve the parliament or not, a group of polled MPs see that there are a number of factors affecting the taking of this decision, including the epidemiological conditions due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the economic conditions, and some internal political files such as the Teachers Syndicate's file and the desire to preserve the current government And external factors, most notably the issue of annexing the Palestinian lands and the deal of the century.

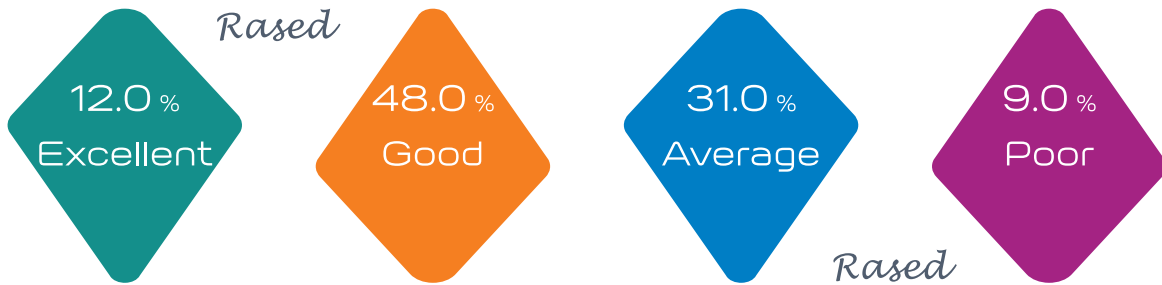


### The expectations of the eighteenth parliament members about the scenario of dissolving parliament or a parliament that delivers a parliament
