Rased: 174 local lists and 25 party lists on the general constituency

registered for the 2024 parliamentary elections

- 954 male and female candidates in the local constituencies.
- 23.3% is the percentage of women running for the parliamentary elections.
- Southern Badia has the least number of lists with 5 lists, and Karak has the highest number of local lists with 17 lists.
- Al-Mithaq and Irada Parties lists on the general constituency have the highest number of candidates.
- 79 former MPs from the 19th parliament are running for the 2024 parliamentary elections in the local constituencies.
- Irbid I and Balqa have the highest number of former MPs running for the 2024 parliamentary elections, and Southern Badia has the least.
- 469 candidates have disclosed their party membership on the local level.
- Rased published the names of the initial lists and (male and female) candidates.

Amman - Jordan

The results of monitoring the process of registering electoral lists for the 2024 parliamentary elections, which were monitored by 54 field monitoring teams distributed across all electoral districts, showed that the number of lists that applied to run for the 2024 parliamentary elections reached 199 lists, 174 of which were at the local constituencies level, while the number of lists running for the general party constituency reached 25 lists.

Regarding the electoral constituencies, the Karak constituency had the highest number of registered lists, reaching 17 lists, followed by the Amman III constituency with 13 lists, the Irbid I constituency with 12 lists, then Irbid II, Zarqa, Balqa and Tafilah with 11 lists, while the Southern Bedouin constituency had the lowest number of lists, with 5 candidate lists.

The results also showed that the Karak constituency had the highest number of candidates with 117 male and female candidates, followed by the Zarqa constituency with 99 male and female candidates, then the Irbid I constituency with 96 male and female candidates, then Balqa with 82

male and female candidates, while the number of candidates in the Irbid II constituency reached 76 male and female candidates, then the Amman III and Amman III constituencies with 71 male and female candidates in each, and Amman I with 59 male and female candidates, followed by Tafilah with 42 male and female candidates, Madaba with 39, then Jerash with 36, the Central Badia with 30, Ajloun with 27, Aqaba with 26, then Mafraq with 24, then Ma'an with 23, then Northern Badia with 21, and finally the Southern Bedouin district with 15 male and female candidates. The number of female candidates at the local constituency level reached 195 women, 19 of whom ran in the competitive path; including 9 women who ran on two women's lists, one in the Balqa and one in the Ajloun constituency.

Regarding party candidates at the local constituency level, the field monitoring team reported that 496 male and female candidates disclosed their party membership among the male and female candidates running for local constituencies.

Regarding male and female candidates at the level of local constituencies who were members of the 19th parliament, 79 candidates ran for the

upcoming parliamentary elections, Where Irbid I and Balqa constituencies had the highest number of male and female candidates from the 19th parliament with 10 male and female candidates in each, followed by Amman II constituency with 9 male and female candidates, then Zarqa constituency with 8 male and female candidates.

In this context, Rased published the names of the initial lists and candidates, and Rased notes that the lists will be updated regularly.
